In his inaugural professorial lecture, Professor Ray Howell will consider aspects of his own research relating to Iron Age social systems, cultural survival in the Romano-British and post-Roman periods and aspects of cultural conflation in Wales.

Professor Howell holds a doctorate from the University of London, King's College. He is the author of several books including *Searching for the Silures*, an Iron Age tribe in south-east Wales published by the History Press in 2009. He is Art and Archaeology Editor of the international journal *Studia Celtica* and

was volume editor of the first two volumes of the new five volume *Gwent County History*. He is an active member of History Research Wales and his chapter on Celticity in Wales

is published in HRW's recently published book, *A New History of Wales*. The book was launched at this year's Hay Literary Festival where he was a featured speaker.

Professor Howell is Director of the South Wales Centre for Historical and Interdisciplinary Research at Newport. He is also Chairman of the Glamorgan Gwent Archaeological Trust, The Glamorgan Gwent Historic Environment Charitable Trust and is General Editor, formerly Chairman and President, of the South Wales Record Society.
